Special events volunteer

The DCAC events wouldn’t be able to happen without the help of volunteers. Special events volunteers join event planning committees and are needed the day of events to help with set up, registration and clean up. The DCAC also need volunteers for the Giving Tree Project during the holidays, which provides needed gifts for children seen at the DCAC, and the DCAC’s monthly sponsorship program, which is a donation program to provide snacks and other items for the children served at the DCAC.

Administrative volunteer

Office assistance is needed as the DCAC has a small staff. Administrative volunteers answer the door and telephone, make copies, scan documents, file, maintain the family waiting room and perform other clerical tasks. Administrative volunteers may also help by organizing donations, decorating for holidays, creating bulletin boards and sanitizing toys.
