

Listening Ears

Used For: Teaches the coping skills of empathy and listening instead of trying to find solutions to problems when others are struggling.

Supplies Needed:

- Rabbit template
- Scissors
- Googly eyes
- Pipe cleaners for whiskers
- Button or pom poms for nose
- Pom pom for tail
- Glue or glue dots
- Markers or Pens



Detailed Description:

We learn early in life that when there is a problem we need to solve it. However, sometimes when someone is struggling what they really need is someone to provide them a supportive listening ear.

To make Listening Ears cut out the rabbit template. Tape, glue or secure the strip into a circle to fit the child's head. The centers of the ears can be colored or printed on colored paper. Glue the center of ear to the outer ear. Attach the ears to the head. Add googley eyes to the face. Cut pipe cleaners into stripes for the whiskers and attach with glue. Add a button or a pom pom for a nose and a pom pom on the back for a tail. Draw on a mouth and wear.






EASY EASTER BUNNY HEADBAND CRAFT

BY RACHEL NIPPER I Heart Crafty Things - TEMPLATE AT END OF DOCUMENT

20 to 30 min. Beginner



STEP 1

Print out the Easter bunny headband craft template on white cardstock. Cut out the template pieces. Download the Free Easter Bunny Headband Template Printable here!



STEP 2

Use the template to cut out the inside section of the bunny ears on patterned pastel color paper. Glue the inside ear sections on the middle of the bunny ears.



STEP 3

Glue the bunny ears onto the back of the bunny face. Then attach a self-adhesive pink button nose in the center of the bunny face. Next glue two googly eyes on your bunny face. Then use a black marker to draw a bunny mouth underneath your button nose.



STEP 4

Cut off six 2-inch pieces of white stretchy cording. Add a generous amount of glue on the sides of the button nose and then attach three whiskers on each side of the nose.



STEP 5

Grab the white rectangle section from the template for the back of the headband. Staple it onto the sides of the bunny face section to cre ate a circle headband.



STEP 6


Add a generous amount of glue in the center on the back of the Easter bunny headband and attach a pom-pom to make a cute, fluffy bunny tail.



STEP 7

Allow time for the glue to dry completely. Then place the Easter bunny headband craft onto child's head for them to enjoy an afternoon full of playful fun. Kids will also love to wear their adorable headband as a festive Easter head piece at a local Easter egg hunt.
